By Act of Parliament, passed in 1795,

All Flag-Officers, Captains, Lieutenants, Masters, and Surgeons, may, on Appointment to Ships from Half-Pay, apply to the Commissioners of the Navy for an Order on the Treasurer to pay them Three Months personal Pay in Advance, or for Three, Six, or Nine, Months Pay, when due.

All Officers on Half-Pay may have it remitted to them (when payable) free of Expence, on signifying the same to the Treasurer of the Navy by Letter.

All Pensioned Officers, the Widows of such, and those entitled to Bounty, &c. (excepting such as are paid by the Paymaster of Widows Pensions,) may have their Pensions remitted free of Expence, on writing to the Treasurer.

DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES TAKEN BY SHIPS IN THE ROYAL NAVY.

THE Value of Prizes is divided into eight equal Parts; of which the Captain, or Captains, have three Eighths; but if a Flag-Officer be on-board, then the Captain or Captains have two Eighths, and the Flag-Officer one Eighth; subject to the Regulations hereafter mentioned.

Captains of Marines and Land Forces, Sea-Lieutenants, and Master, one Eighth between them; and if a Physician to the Fleet or Squadron be actually on-board, he is included in this Class.

The Lieutenants and Quarter-Masters of Marines; Lieutenants, Ensigns, and Quarter-Masters of Land Forces; Secretaries of Admirals or Commodores; Boatwains, Gunners, Purser, Carpenter, Master's Mates, Surgeon, Pilot, and Chaplain, one Eighth between them.

The Midshipmen, Captain's Clerk, Master-Sailmaker, Schoolmaster, Carpenter's Mates, Boatwain's Mates, Gunner's Mates, Master-at-Arms, Corporals, Yeoman of the Sheets, Cockswains, Quarter-Masters, Quarter-Master's Mates, Surgeon's Mates, Yeomen of the Powder-Room, Serjeants of Marines and Land Forces on-board; one Eighth between them.

The Trumpeters, Quarter-Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Stewards, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunsmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, Marines and other Soldiers, and other Persons assisting in going Duty on-board; two Eighths between them.

REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE FLAG-OFFICER'S ONE EIGHTH.

First. Where there is one Flag-Officer only upon a Service, he has the One-Eighth of all Prizes taken by Ships under his Command.—Secondly. A Flag-Officer, sent to command abroad, is not entitled to share till he arrives and takes up his Command.—Thirdly. If an inferior Flag-Officer is sent to reinforce a superior Flag-Officer abroad, the superior Flag is not to share any Prizes, taken by the inferior Flag before he arrives and receives some Order from the superior Flag.—Fourthly. A Chief Flag-Officer, returning from abroad, has no share of Prizes taken by the Ships left behind to under another Command.—Fifthly. If a Flag-Officer is sent to command at the Out-Port of this Kingdom, he has no share of Prizes taken by Ships which fall from that Port by Order of the Admiralty.—Sixthly. When more Flag-Officers than one serve together, the Eighth is thus distributed, viz. if two Flags, the Chief has Two-Thirds of the Eighth, and the other the remaining Third; but, if more than two Flags, the Chief has One-Half of the Eighth, and the remaining Half is divided among the other Flags.—Seventhly. Commodores, with Captains under them, are considered as Flag-Officers.—Eighthly. The First Captain to the Admiral and Commander in Chief, and also the First Captain to a Flag-Officer command a Fleet of Twenty Ships of the Line, are considered as Flag-Officers, and these as the junior Flag-Officers of such Fleet.

REGULATIONS CONCERNING CUTTERS, &c. COMMANDED BY LIEUTENANTS.

First. Such Lieutenants have Three Eighths; but, if under a Flag-Officer, the Flag has One Eighth, and the Lieutenant Two-Eighths.—Secondly. The Share of the Master, or other Person being second in Command, and the Pilot (if on-board) is One-Eighth; of which Two-Thirds is for the Master, or second in Command, and One-Third to the Pilot; but, there be no Pilot, then the Whole of the One-Eighth is for the Master or second in Command.—Thirdly. Surgeon, or Surgeon's Mate (where there is no Surgeon) Midshipman, and Clerk and Steward; One-Eighth between them.—Fourthly. Boatwain's, Gunner's and Carpenter's Mates; Yeomen of the Sheets, Sailmaker, Quarter-Master, and Quarter-Master's Mate; One-Eighth between them.—Fifthly. The Seamen, Marines, and other Persons on-board, assisting in the Capture Two-Eighths between them.

These Regulations are for Captures made by Cutters, &c. when no other of his Majesty's Ships or Vessels of War are Sight; for, in that Case, the Lieutenants, Officers, &c. on-board the Cutter, share only as Persons of equal Rank.

HEAD-MONEY. The Commissioners of the Navy pay  $\text{£}1$ . for every Man who was living at the Beginning of the Engagement on-board any hostile Ship, taken, burnt, sunk, or otherwise destroyed; and this Bounty is distributed in the same Proportions as the Value of Prizes above mentioned.

GRATUITIES TO THE RELATIONS OF OFFICERS AND OTHERS SLAIN IN FIGHT WITH THE ENEMY.

- I. To a widow, a full year's pay according to the post her husband served in at his death.
- II. Orphans, each the one third proportion of a widow; and posthumous children are esteemed orphans.
- III. Orphans married are not entitled to any bounty.
- IV. If there is no widow, a mother (if a widow, and above fifty years of age) is entitled to a widow's share.
- V. The relations of officers of fire-ships are entitled to the same bounty as those of officers of like rank in fourth rates.
- VI. Captains are to set down the names of the slain at the end of the muster-book, and on what occasion.
- VII. This bounty extends to those who are slain in tenders, in boats, or on-shore, as well as those on-board the ships; and to those who are slain in fight with pirates, or in an encounter with the ships or friends by mistake; also those who die of their wounds after battle are all esteemed as persons slain.
